- Review and revise the Nevada Trauma Registry to incorporate health equity data elements such as social determinants of health.
- Contribute to the planning and evaluation of the annual Rural Preparedness Summit, including logistics coordination and post-event analysis.
- Review and provide feedback on scope-of-work documents submitted by program subrecipients.
- Support the compilation of the End-of-Year progress report, summarizing program outcomes and achievements.

- Work collaboratively with section and agency staff, other interns, and partners to develop and execute project deliverables for any of the projects listed above;
- Assist with data collection and maintenance;
- Assist in the development and dissemination of educational, promotional and other marketing materials;
